GATE FULFORD, a township in the East Riding, is also a suburb on the south of the city.

HEWORTH, also in the North Riding and now forming part of the city, is on the north-east.

HOLGATE, a township in the West Riding, now forms part of the western portion of the extended city.

CLEMENTHORPE and LAYERHORPE are localities in the city, respectively on the Ouse and the Foss streams.
