

EASINGWOLD,

WITH THE PARISHES OF ALNE AND STILLINGTON AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

EASINGWOLD is a market town and township in the parish of its name and wapentake of Bulmer, North Riding, 208 miles from London, and 13 n. by w. from York, lying on the high road from London and York to Edinburgh; from being thus situated the inhabitants derived some benefit, and two good inns were supported thereby, of which they have been almost entirely deprived by the contiguity of a great railway. The trade is now but inconsiderable, except in the articles of bacon and butter, of which large quantities are sent from hence to York, and much reach the London market. George Wombwell, Esq., of Newborough Park, in this vicinity, is lord of the manor, and holds a court leet and baron, generally in the months of May and October.

The places of worship are the parish church, dedicated to All Saints, and chapels for independents, primitive and Wesleyan methodists, and Roman catholics; the last mentioned, a very neat edifice, was erected by subscription, and for the first time opened for divine service on the 21st November, 1833. The benefice of Easingwold is a discharged vicarage, in the patronage of the bishop of Chester. There are two free schools: one founded in 1781, by Mrs. Eleanor Westerman, for boys and girls, well endowed; the other, with a smaller endowment, is for ten boys: there likewise are Sunday schools in the parish. The country in this part is fertile,

and agriculture prevails, but the dairy is also profitable. The scenery in the neighbourhood is of a pleasing character, particularly that surveyed from the eminence on which the church is seated, which commands an extensive view of the ancient forest of Galtres and the vale of Mowbray. The market is on Friday; the fairs are, April 2nd, July 6th and September 26th, for horses and cattle. The population of the parish, including the chapelry of RASKELF, in 1831, was 2,381,—of which number 1,922 were returned for the township.

ALNE is a parish, partly in the liberty of St. Peter, of York, East Riding, but chiefly in the wapentake of Bulmer, North Riding; and is mainly to be noticed as having within its limits a station on the line of the Great North of England railway, which station is rather more than four miles s.s.w. from Easingwold. The places of worship are the parish church, a handsome structure, dedicated to St. Mary, and a chapel for Wesleyan methodists. Population of the parish 1,552, and of the township 415.

STILLINGTON is a parish about 4½ miles s. s. e. from Easingwold. The celebrated Lawrence Sterne held this living, and resided, for some years, at Sutton, in this vicinity. The places of worship are the church (dedicated to St. Nicholas), and a Wesleyan methodist chapel. Population about 700.

POST OFFICE, Long-street, EASINGWOLD, Leonard Smith, *Post Master*.—Letters from LONDON and all parts of the East, South and West arrive every morning at ten, and are despatched every morning at five.—Letters from EDINBURGH, COXWOLD, NEWBOROUGH, CRAIKE and all parts of the North arrive every morning at ten, and are despatched every afternoon at ten minutes before three.
